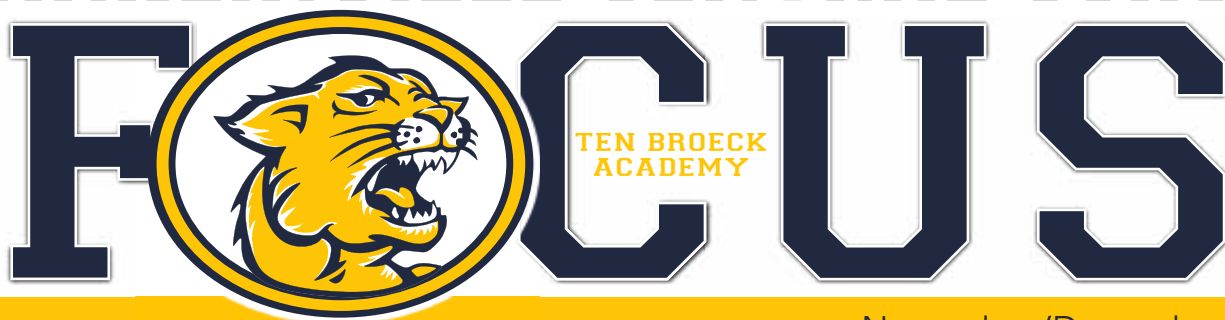

Attention Seniors: Please bring your college acceptance letters, college scholarships and awards to the Counseling Center. If you need help applying to college and/or for financial aid, or if you are interested in applying for a job and/or enlisting in the Military and need help with the next steps, please let me know. We will be working on scholarships in History and English class throughout the year. All seniors are eligible to apply for our Graduation Awards. More information is forthcoming.

Attention Juniors and Seniors: To qualify for scholarships, students must submit a resume and recommendation letters to the Counseling Center. Juniors and Seniors had a great time attending the College Consortium on September 20th and were able to speak with representatives from several colleges in and around WNY. Juniors and Seniors will also tour Alfred State College on October 19th. We will continue to host and attend college visits throughout the year.
